

The solution

Because the bathroom was a good size, there was room to box-off the pipework to allow for a wall-hung WC and basin unit. This created a sleek, minimalist look.

The client chose a Crosswater Infinity shower screen with a deflector panel so they could have a practical walk-in shower. They opted for black detailing to tie-in with the Original Style tiles.



The Vado Omika brassware was chosen specifically for it's beautiful geometric detailing. It adds some quirk to the minimalist design of the bathroom and matches in with the brassware in the downstairs cloakroom.



Creating this bathroom was a joy. The clients knew the look and feel that they wanted, so it was a great room to work on.

We matched in with some of the elements of the statement cloakroom downstairs, but kept the overall design paired back. However, we did use the beautiful Vado brassware to give it a hint of quirk.
